

About This Issue

Combat, as experienced by and recorded by E.P. Motley, a combat artilleryman in World War II, is the journal-length feature of this issue of WLA. A compelling, personal account of a particularly difficult military campaign in the Italian Alps, Memoirs of Six Months was written over a generation ago. Once written, the manuscript lay unread until 1990, when it came to the attention of Motley's three children, some 17 years after the author's death. Motley's record of the taking of Riva Ridge convinced us that the Lieutenant's memoir deserved a wider audience than merely his immediate family. Lieutenant Motley's telling is, at once, meditative, honest, knowing, and eloquent. We are pleased to publish his work, which is appearing in an edited and public version for the first time.
